meeting, seconded and carried.

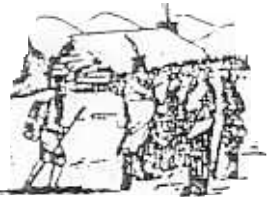
Jerry Schuyler-requested that Tribe pay the gas and electric
