Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving ormy at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

Discussion on do we need and are we ready for a second Industrial Park? We should seriously look at what we want to use it for.

Carl Rasmussen stated we have 34 acres and at sometime we will have to make provisions as how to use it. This is a 20 year plan (1980-2000). Carl also stated it will be updated every 5-7 years.

Mark made a motion to strike the second Industrial Park from the Comprehensive Plan. Wanda seconded. Vote was 2 for and 2 against. Chrmn Powless voted in favor of the motion. Motion carried.

Another area which was discussed was the Economic Development, that which being opening a liquor shop. Discussion as to how it would or would not benefit the Tribe.

Mark made a motion to strike the liquor shop from the Comprehensive Plan. Edwin seconded. Vote was 2 for and 2 against. Chrmn. Powless voted against motion. Motion carried.

Another topic of dicussion was the sewer districts. Would it service the areas adquately? It was decided that page 67 would have to be reworded and brought to the Business Committee.

Norbert made a motion to adopt the Comprehensive As corrected. Edwin seconded. Vote was 3 for with 1 opposing. (Mark) Motion carried.

Mark made a motion to adjourn at 10:10 am. Edwin seconded. Meeting adjourned.
