Meeting was called to order at 9:10 a.m. Purpose of the meeting was to review two resolutions drafted by Edwin.

First resolution considered asked for Technical Assistance monies from the BIA in the amount of \$2000 to finance a package for the development of the Industrial Park. This resolution references the Avalos venture. Motion was made by Norbert to adopt the resolution. Margaret seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

The second resolution asked for funds from the BIA 638 monies to help finance the legal fees and design investigative reports the Tribe wants done by Mr. Roeser. This information was per Myron Peterson through a phone call to the Chairman and amounts to \$2000 also. This money must be spent "to strengthen Tribal Government". Norbert moved to adopt the resolution. Mark seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Norbert requested travel permission to attend the NCAI meeting on June 13 - 15, 1979, in Reno, Nevada. His expenses would be his own and he would submit a travel report as required. Mark moved to approve the request. Margaret seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark moved to adjourn Pat seconded. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 9:15 a.m.
