Informal meeting with Bingo Committee

Bingo Committee present: Sonny King, Pat Misikin, Alma Webster, Sandra Ninham, Audrey Doxtator

Mark asked Bingo Committee just how much money is in the Bingo account. Much discussion about how much money is taken in, how much is paid out, what is paid out, who is paid and how much. Mark made the statement that if the Bingo Committee is unable to furnish these kinds of records, that someone may have to be hired to do this.

Alma stated there is \$127,000 in savings, + the general fund, and \$20,000 in CD for 90 days earning 9 1/2 % interest.

Discussion of using Bingo money to build the Tobacco Warehouse. This had been referred to the Finance Committee. Another suggestion was to pay off the Farm. Sonny suggested the Bingo Committee meet with the Finance Committee. The Chairman will check with local banks for interest rates.

Discussion of Bingo money for the Nursing Home. No one knew for sure when this was discontinued.

The Bingo Committee was asked to come back with up to-date records and report on Bingo operations. A special meeting will be held at 9:00 a.m. August 17 at the Tribal Building.
