Purpose of the meeting was to go over the Financial Plans for 1980 for the Nursing Home.

The Nursing Home propose to become completely independent in the financial operations by January 1, 1980.

Wendell suggested that they might continue the operation the way it is for 6 more months, by then we will have a Controller. If they become independent other programs will want to do the same and it will also affect our indirect cost.

Mr. Hardman said some of the problems they are having is: 1. Not getting the information they need. 2. Not getting the correct information from the accounting office.

Wendell made a motion to accept the recommendation of the Tribal Attorney. Mark seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Anna John: Anna stated her job is Elderly Service Counselor, not Nutrition Counselor. The Area Agency of Aging program will start January 1, 1980. These are two jobs, Anna has been neglecting her work in order to do the book work that is involved in the Nutrition Counselor Program. Mark made a motion that the Commission on Aging take over the Nutrition Director position January 1, 1980. Norbert seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Norbert moved to adjourn at 8:05. Edwin seconded. Motion carried
