March 24, 1980

1:45 p.m.

PRESENT: Chrmn. Purcell Powless, V-Chrmn. Norbert Hill, Secretary Wanda Webster, Mark Powless, Margaret Doxtater, Loretta Metoxen.

ALSO PRESENT: Ernie Stevens, Jerry Fischer, Mike King, Francis Skenandore.

Purpose of the meeting was to review the Management Agreement between the Oneida Tribe and the Oneida Tribal Development Corporation.

Ernie and Francis went over the items in the Management Agreement.

Ernie stated that the Manager of OTDC should handle all managements and negotiations in a business like manner as the Development Corporation can sue and be sued.

Item 11 Renewal: "By written notice at least sixty days prior to the expiration of the original terms of this agreement, Tribe may indicate intention to renew. If such notice be given then the Agreement shall be extended for an additional one year term on the same terms as contained herein."

This Management Agreement will be until December 31, 1980 and will be extended each year by mutual agreement.

Norbert made a motion to adopt the Management Agreement. Loretta seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Ernie invited everyone to OTDC on March 25, 1980 at 3:00 p.m. to see his accounting system.

Meeting adjourned at 2:55 p.m.
