Purpose of the meeting was to discuss member of the Business Committee that will be working with the Commission on Aging and also the termination of Senior Citizen's Coordinator.

Chrmn. Powless stated that Oneida's Commission on Aging is more advanced than other Tribes.

Discussion on Senior Citizen Coordinator position being terminated 4/1/80. Hurley stated the Commission on Aging does not agree with the position being terminated, due to the fact that who will do the monthly reports, the 1981 plan, proposal writing.

The ANA Director should coordinate the Senior Citizens programs, or designate someone to do the reports and the planning.

It was the recommendation of the Personnel Manager that the Senior Citizens Coordinator was not necessary.

Nancy Webster stated that the Senior Center Manager will work just with the Senior Center. Funding for this position is from CETA-Brown County.

It was decided that Nancy would show the Business Committee persons in charge of the Senior Citizens the files and explain some of the things that need to be done on Thursday. Norbert is the person in charge of the Senior Citizens, Myron is in charge of the Epsworth Hall and Edwin in charge of the information and referral center. The operation of these programs will go on as usual.
