Joe stated there needs to be some kind of punishment for those Program Directors that have missed three meetings in a row, Joe will come up with something and recommend to the Business Committee.

Joe also gave a report on the Red Book Committee, he has gotten in touch with most of them and four stated they no longer want to be on the Committee. Suggestions on how to get people to serve on the Committee and finish the Red Book were:

1) Pay five people to serve on the Committee, 2) Get people to volunteer 3) Work or have a University finish it. Joe estimated about 80%-90% of the Red Book is complete.

The Personnel Manager stated there is a need to up date personnel files, new forms will be sent out to all programs for employees to fill out, also state withholding forms. Someone from the Personnel Office will pich them up on Wednesday.

The official indirect cost rate is 23.2% for the Oneida Tribe, this is through September 30, 1980. Copies will be sent to all Program Directors.

Loretta Webster gave some ideas of what should be in the FY 1981 638 proposal. Some of the suggestions were: 1. Editor & Report for the Kali Wisaks, 2. Recreation Director, 3. Land Office - Title Seacher, 4. Litigation Coordinator, 5. Language Trainees,

6. Law Office, 7. Senior Citizens Coordinatot, 8. Health Center expansion, 9. Adminstration Building, 10. Bingo Hall, 11. Duplex - OTDC, 12. Central Mailroom. 13. Pay the balance of the computor which is \$20,000.

Lloyd stated economic development should come out of 638 monies, such as a bingo hall or adminstration building. It was the consensus of the people in attendance that a bingo hall would be the priority for the FY 81 638 monies. The Bingo Committee, OTDC, Planning Office and Land Committee will get together and start making plans.
