PRESENT: Chairman, Purcell Powless; Secretary, Wanda Webster; Treasurer, Wendell McLester; Mark Powless, Edwin King Jr

The Treasurer requested a special meeting to discuss the Tribe's financial situation. He suggested a meeting on Monday with the Controller, a prior meeting had been scheduled for after the regular meeting on Monday, Wendell stated the meeting should be at 10:30 A.M. Wendell stated he is not always informed of all the matters in the accounting office, the Tribe is in a bad financial situation, recommendations will be presented on Monday. Action will have to be taken on administrative lay offs. The accounting office have been using funds from other accounts to meet payroll. Indirect cost monies are coming from some programs, that is our biggest problem, the Tribe subsidizes a lot of the programs that do not or cannot pay the 26.6 per cent indirect cost rate. The new indirect cost proposal is in the process of being done. Wendell stated if there is a lay-off, two-thirds of administration will be affected, and if there is a re-call, it will be only those people that are needed.

The Chairman stated that people from the Accounting office are talking about tribal business in the community, and he asked that Wendell talk to the staff and inform them not to discuss Tribal business anyplace.

Discussion on the meeting on the Shoreland Ordinance that will be held at the Hobart Town hall at 2:30 P.M. today.

Meeting ended at 10:20 A.M.
