June 1, 1981

Barbara stated there was less money that has come to the Tribe this year because of the new warehouse, once the warehouse is in full operation the sales will increase.

Anna asked why the Tribe changes banks so often, it was explained to her why the Tribe is now with the State Bank of DePere.

Motion was made by Loretta that in the interim period we accept the \$5,000 for the month of June and the \$50,000 on June 30, 1981 when the CD's mature. Mark seconded. Vote was 3 for with 1 abstention (Margaret). Motion carried.
