Joe stated the accounting office has received all the information from programs on the status of their funding for next year.

Discussion on the possibility of programs getting cut, Joe stated Program Director's will have to inform their employees of possible lay-offs or come up with ideas of what to do in cutting down.

Brenda Kindness stated the ITAC proposal will be started on today. Bruce King stated that as of September 30, 1981, CETA will be losing 10 PSE slots, and it is the mood in Congress to move those positions over to the ANA program.

Lengthy discussion followed on the Early Childhood program, Ruby White stated if that program does not get funded it would effect 8 staff people and 60 children. She also stated that the staff is aware of the possibility of the Early Childhood proposal not being funded, and not being recalled in September.

Joe suggested that Program Director's should evaluate their programs and anticipate and plan in cuts that may be coming.
