Presentation was given by Waste Management, remarks were made: by Walter Weissbach Discussion: there would be a need for 150 to 200 acres of land. The Tribe would contract to operate the facility and would receive a royalty on fees. It was requested by the Business Committee that Waste Management provide the Tribe with a solid waste management plan.

## SEPTIC AND WELLS:

Audrey stated the drain field at the Nursing Home and Health Center have crust forming under and pushing affluent. There is \$5,675.00 available for the project, Sanitation Services, Inc. would do the project, but they need \$3,000 down. The laundry at the Nursing Home is too much for the septic system.

Motion was made by Loretta to approve the \$5,675.00 for the septic system at the Health Center and Nursing Home. Edwin seconded. Vote was 3 for with 1 abstention (Mark). Motion carried.
