Meeting was called to order at 8:45 A.M.

Reviewed election ordinance. Wanda agreed to act as Roll Clerk because Carol Silva is a candidate. Chanages made in the election ordinance:

1. One judge and one clerk will verify with a Tribal Enrollment Clerk who shall be present with the necessary enrollment books.

Howard moved to adopt the ordinance as amended. Seconded by Norbert. Motion carried nanimously.

KALIHWI'SAKS

Liaison person was approached regarding the General Tribal Council report. It was agreed that reporting was bad. The Business Committee discussed with the Personnel Manager, Tribal Manager and Law Office.

In executive session the Business Committee decided to leave remedial action to the discretion of the Personnel Manager, Tribal Manager and Liaison person.

Budget and Finance reported on Nursing Home revision budget, Income Maintenance budget, Health expansion fund.

Mark moved to approve the report. Seconded by Howard. Motion carried unanimously.

HEALTH CENTER

Chairman commented - self sufficiency can be gained by putting on full time third party billings. Director comments that the Health Center staff is top heavy.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPER

Economic Developer presented a budget for renovating and starting up convenience store and station. Total package is actual figures: \$295,856

Tribes Share: 81,297

Loan: 214,557 @ 13½%

Mark moved to approve the entire package. Frank seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Budget reflects on indirect cost to Tribe.

Frank moved to adjust the busget so that the indirect cost comes out of line item. Mark conded. Motion carried unanimously.

Met with the Comptroller in regards to his memo dated 1/19/82 addressed to the Business Committee. His concerns addressed the exit conference with the BIA Auditor; reportedly secret meetings held between the Auditor and the Business COmmittee; line of authority.
