Report on Election of 1/23/82:

Election was conducted without full election committee. Nearly 80 persons voted, many elderly. Due to inclement weather conditions, election was called off at 1:00 P.M. with the intent to continue at a later date. Board members present at the election were: Lloyd Powless- Judge, (Chairman); Ben Vieau-Judge; Joan McLester - Clerk; Bev Schoen - Clerk (arrived at noon) and Wanda Webster as roll clerk.

Following discussion with the Attorneys the consensus of the Business Committee was to void the election and reschedule.

Howard moved to nullify the election results of January 23, 1982; destroy the ballots as of this date; reschedule election for February 6, 1982. Norbert seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark moved to pay all the election committee members who showed up. Frank seconded. Motion carried with Wendell abstaining.

Jerry asked to be on tomorrows agenda concerning codes.

Meeting at 7:00 P.M. tonight with the Land Committee on the Shoreland Ordinance. Francis spoke breifly on Docket 301, a memo will be forthcoming to the Business Committee. Also entered into some discussion with the Attorneys of enrollments/relinquishments.

Tony moved to adopt resolution 1-25-82A. Howard seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

January 26, 1982

January 26, 1982:

Discussed Kalihwi Saks situation with Joe Villegomez. Disciplinary action taken concerning the last issue:

- 1. Direction to correct no corrections were made
- 2. Contact persons who were quoted none made
- 3. Change form from minute form not done
- 4. Conflicting dates of election not corrected

Recommendation was two week suspension without pay for the Editor.

Report was that Bev Schoen complained to the Green Bay Post Office without authority, concerning mailing of Kalihwi'Saks.

Move to recess until 1:30 by Norbert. Seconded by Frank. Motion carried.
