MINUTES OF SPECIAL GENERAL TRIBAL COUNCIL MEETING SATURDAY, OCTOBER 1, 1983 - IRENE MOORE ACTIVITY CENTER

The Special Meeting was called to order at 10:30 A.M. by Chairman Purcell Powless. Thirty-eight (38) people were present for the General Tribal Council meeting that was called for the approval of the FY '84 Tribal budget.

1984 TRIBAL BUDGET

The Chairman called the Business Committee to order. Kathy Hughes answered questions from the floor concerning the budget. After all questions were answered, Loretta Metoxen made a motion to approve the budget as presented. Richard Hill seconded. Motion carried.

A resolution had been prepared for the General Tribal Council for approval of the FY '84 budget. The Tribal Secretary, Gordon McLester read the resolution. Mark Powless made a motion to add "Whereas, in the absence of a quorum of the General Tribal Council, that the Business Committee conduct the business of the Oneida Tribe pursuant to the Oneida Constitution." Lois seconded. Motion carried.


Mark made a motion to adopt Resolution 310-1-83-A (See Attached), Loretta seconded. Motion carried.
