DISCUSSION ON LETTER FROM ANN SKENANDORE CONCERNING CIGARETTES

The Law Office was asked to review the request and to bring back a recommendation. The following is the letter the Law Office drafted:

Dear Mrs. Skenandore:

This is in response to your letter to Gordon McLester, Tribal Secretary, dated March 13, 1984 inquiring about a tribal license to sell cigarettes at your place of business.

Under the present Oneida Tobacco Ordinance, private licenses are not provided for. Therefore, unless and until the ordinance is changed, no license can be granted to sell the cigarettes you referred to.

You are free to discuss this with the Oneida Business Committee as your letter requests. If you have any other questions regarding this matter, you may address them to the Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee. Thank you.

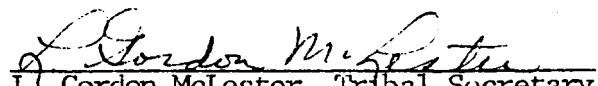
Salary Adjustment for Wanda Webster: From 9/5 @ \$6.38/hr to 12/2 \$6.61/hr.
