- The Tribal governing body shall review the contract and any 4. amendments thereto before execution.
- The proposed date for start of the contract is May 1, 1984 and 5. shall be effective through July 31, 1984.

220-DRAFT LETTER TO ELMER M. SAVILLA - Jerry Hill

This is to object to the above letter. The tune of your letter is not only contradictory to the work of the National Indian Task Force on Gaming, it is also contrary to the actions taken by the assembled Tribal Chairmen on Resolution 16 (copies attached).

Please inform me when the National Tribal Chairmen met and changed their position with regard to the Oneida Tribe and the National Task Force on Indian Gaming. As you know, our tribe has supported the National Tribal Chairmen's Association since its inception and we have generally supported its positions and have appreciated their support on other specific matters such as the Ancient Indian Land Claims Settlement Act, which we jointly opposed. We are not disagreeing from the premise of your letter that Indian tribes do not need authorization for bingo and are capable governmentally to regulate such activity. We regulate our own bingo according to our own tribal ordinance. We have improved our facilities and our bingo activities with our own funds without any assistance and approval from the federal government. Many other tribes also operate in the same fashion. Thus, the apparent difference between what the Oneida Tribe and the National Indian Task Force on Gaming is not different from the position stated in your letter, and that point should be clarified to the other chairmen. This is inaccurate and misleading.
