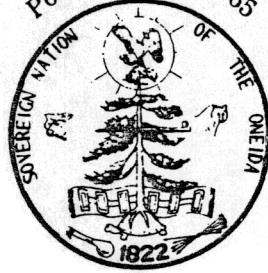


Military Leave has not been included in our present draft, a recommendation will be drafted for review.
