1. Space Costs: Bill Gollnick stated that the space cost for the Tribal School had gone up from \$62,000 last year to \$132,000 for this year. This has caused some concern because the Tribal School will not receive enough funding to meet that amount of space cost, but he has been meeting with Don Wilson and they have worked out a way to meet this expense.

Discussion also covered the cafeteria costs.

- 2. High School Feasibility Study: There was a lengthy discussion on having an Oneida High School. The feasibility study stated that at this time, they are not ready to give a report, except that more study is needed and the School Board was not ready to make any recommendations.
- 3. Public Relations: There was discussion on different ways to get positive information out to the Tribal members about the Tribal School. Bill Gollnick will work with Charles Leonard on this matter.
