#### TABLED UNFINISHED BUSINESS (III)

PRESENTATION: Facilities Plan - Gary Rosenbeck/Cathy Porter

Problem Areas: 22% non-tribal members to be served own over 50% of the land. Cost per user with 25% - 50% grant will range from \$2,800 - \$4,200 for connection fee and \$40 - \$50 monthly user fee.

Facilities plan is for development of land north of the bridge in Oneida following the Duck Creek valley. the treatment site is proposed at the end of Dead End Road.

## Facilities Plan (Continued)

Loretta Metoxen moved to approve of the sewer plan subject to an approved land use plan, Ernie Stevens seconded. Rick Hill and Amelia Cornelius abstained. Motion carried.

Ernie Stevens moved to approve the concept of the legal documents subject to review and approval of the Business Committee. Kathy Hughes seconded. Rick Hill and Amelia Cornelius abstained. Motion carried.

The issue of the Facilities Plan and Sewer Ordinance need to be completed by January 1, 1989. There was discussion on the need to meet with the Hobart Town Officials and with the people directly affected by the Sewer system before making a final decision.

Kathy Hughes moved to approve the creation of the two policies and to have Public Hearings before implementation. Amelia Cornelius seconded. Motion carried.

c Proposed Personnel Policies & Procedures

There have been two public hearings and some comments have been incorporated into the revised draft. Rick Hill moved to adopt the revised Personnel Policies and Procedure with the following conditions:

- 1) A "grandfather" provision that allows actions taken or required prior the the formal implementation date of these policies to be concluded under the Personnel Policies and Procedures adopted April, 1985 (the current Policies and Procedures).
- 2) A period of introduction and training regarding the new policies and procedures be designed and implemented by the Human Resources Department to be carried out within the next two (2) months with attendance by all Tribal managers and supervisors of Tribal personnel required. Interested Tribal employees should be invited to participate in this activity.
- 3) A target date of November 15 be established for the completion, production and distribution of an Employee Manual of Personnel Policies and distribution of an Employee Manual of Personnel Policies and Procedures. The recommended format is a three-ring binder with each section printed separately to allow for minor revisions to be accomplished without unnecessary cost or effort.

Personnel Policies & Procedures (Continued)

- 4) The Personnel Commission be appointed by October 28, 1988. The Personnel Commission and the Business Committee should formally meet as soon as possible thereafter and establish rules and regulations under which the Personnel commission will conduct business as identified and required by the new Personnel Policies and Procedures. The Human Resources Manager should conduct interviews with each of the current members of the Personnel Commission to ascertain problems and concerns regarding current conduct and procedure, and recommend consistent policies and procedures to serve as a catalyst for this process.
- 5) The Human Resources Manager should develop and implement the ongoing Equal Employment Opportunity training/certification workshops as required by the new policies.

Motion seconded by Kathy Hughes, Ernie Stevens abstained. Motion carried.

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin recognizes the need for a program for children of parents achieving these goals, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has demonstrated its ability to work with and provide services for low-income families, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin would like to apply for a national grant to provide seed monies for a child care program.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin apply for a Department of Housing and Urban Development Child Care Demonstration Grant.

Rick Hill moved to adopt Resolution #10-7-88-A, Loretta Metoxen seconded. Motion carried.

# (2) Support for Funke & Associates Contract for ANA

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is interested in providing input in the selection of consultants hired by the Administration for Native Americans Programs who are being considered to provide training and technical assistance to the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has received minimal training and technical assistance in the recent past, and

WHEREAS, the firm of Karl A. Funke & Associates is applying for a contract to provide the ANA training and technical assistance in Area 1, which includes the State of Wisconsin and would provide services to the Oneida Tribe of Indians, among others, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe is familiar with the plan which is being proposed by Funke & Associates, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe is familiar with many of the consultants participating on the proposed team and considered to be highly qualified, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee presently is evaluating methods of increasing the uses of such consultants.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin fully supports and endorses the proposal which has been submitted to the Administration for Native Americans and expresses its intent to utilize such services; and urges that the ANA training and technical assistance contract for Area I be awarded to Funke & Associates.

Ernie Stevens moved to adopt Resolution #10-7-88-B, Amelia Cornelius seconded. Motion carried.
