Discussion on proposed agricultural fee scale for tribal & non-tribal members.

The scale varies depending upon acreage of land and the present condition of the land.

Discussion on Farm Project - Proposed lands to be used on the Smit Farm, Pyleart Farm, and part of the former Seminary lands. There will be a schedule developed to show use of land with a time frame showing when certain events are to be started and completed.

Part of the project would be to develop a distinct breed of cattle - proposed name "Oneida Reds" which would be  $\frac{1}{4}$  Red Angus  $\frac{3}{8}$  Charolais and  $\frac{3}{8}$  Farentaise.

Labor would consist of 2.5 - 3.5 persons including himself (he is a veterinarian).
