1. Native American Task Force on Domestic Abuse Res. #1-6-89-A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee acknowledges that the Native American Task Force consists of Native American individuals who have been involved in the Domestic Abuse field either as a service provider or volunteer, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee in support of the Native American Task Force realizes the devastating effects domestic abuse has on our families, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee recognizes the need for a Native American shelter in the State of Wisconsin.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians supports the Native American Task Force Domestic Abuse to plan and implement a Native American Shelter for all eleven Tribes in northern Wisconsin.

2. Dept. of Defense Contracts Resolution # 1-6-89-B

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has developed a recent economic development process which has established enterprises which include but are not limited to a hotel bingo hall, retail outlets, real estate, printing and a scientific research laboratory, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is eligible to market its enterprise products and services to the United States Department of Defense and other Federal Agencies as a minority and/or Disadvantaged Enterprise, and

WHEREAS, The United States Defense Department offers technical assistance to minority and/or disadvantaged enterprises to sell goods and services to the United States Defense Department, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin would benefit from the defense department marketing technical assistance.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin officially requests the United States Department of Defense to provide the Tribe with technical assistance to market the existing printing services and environmental testing laboratory services presently available that the Tribe presently produces.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe also requests the necessary resources to establish a planning program that will enable the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin to contract with the United States Department of Defense.
