On site visits to the following buildings: Business Office, Men's Dorm, Wonder Hall, Cafeteria, Chapel/Classrooms/Library, Pool, Gym, Administrative Building, School.

Cafeteria: Possible use for elderly meals and other large meetings, bingo, can seat up to 300. Needs windows, minor repairs to outside, renovation of interior, painting, etc., kitchen equipment in fairly good shape, baking equipment in another room.

School: Best of all the buildings, presently used for school, daycare and Manpower office.

Library/Chapel/Classrooms: Needs lot of repair work.

Administrative Building: Needs about \$10,000 for replacement of windows, needs painting and flooring. Could be used for office space for Indian programs.

full size olympic pool, paint is peeling and needs a new roof.

Floor is buckling, needs roof and windows

Wonder Hall: is in good shape and is to be used

Elderly apartment: did not visit but is reported to be in good repair, all apartments are rented out.

Men's Dorm: Did not visit.

All the buildings are heated.


Presently the Pottawatomie are working with the City of Milwaukee, BIA, and School to put the land in trust status. All buildings will comply with the city codes. The Menominee Valley area is where they would have the gaming ventures as there is a higher volume of traffic.

The school is requesting the Oneida Tribe to assist with \$10,000 to repair the windows in the Administrative Building.

Afternoon Community Meeting:
