Update on current status of off-reservation sales of TV Bingo. Letter from Flynn to vendors. Waiting for letter from Assistant General's office to Flynn. The Assistant General's office has no intention of arresting anyone in conjunction with TV Bingo, however, they cannot speak for the local county District Attorneys.

Purpose of visit is to review the general business operations of Oneida TV Bingo and present a report to the Assistant General's office to assist in the determination whether the off-reservation sales are legal or illegal.

The Tribal position is that the Tribe has been open and above board in the game and that it is conducting a lawful operation. Bingo is a Class II Game and is legal and that all activity to it is legal.
