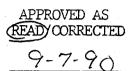

REGULAR MEETING

FRIDAY, AUGUST 31, 1990

Chairman Hill gave an opening prayer.

I. CALL TO ORDER: Meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m.

Debbie Doxtator moved to defer this matter to the Environmental Health Department and the Land office to research, and come back to the Business Committee with a recommendation. Loretta Metoxen seconded. Motion carried

B. INFORMATION: Tribal School Board Resolutions

- 1) Support of proposal for New School Construction by MACTS, Inc.
- 2) Authority to contract in Accordance with P.L. 100-297, Sec. 5204

Loretta Metoxen stated that she is in support of the first resolution, but did not understand the meaning of the second resolution. Chairman Hill designated Julie Barton to follow-up and bring back more detailed information.

2. REQUESTS

A. Request Letter of Support for Dan Hawk - Shirley Hill

Mr. Hawk needs a Letter of Support from the Tribe for an Incubator Business he is proposing for the Tribe. Mr. Hawk has all documents in place, and needs the letter of support to apply for funding. Loretta Metoxen stated that she was unable to prepare a draft letter of support, but will do so in this following week.

Julie Barton moved to approve Loretta Metoxen writing up a letter of support from the Oneida Tribe for Mr. Hawk, and that copies be sent to the Business Committee. Russell Metoxen seconded. Loretta Metoxen abstained. Motion carried.

B. Request for Bingo Passes for:

- 1) (4 Passes) Internation Chapter of 'National Executive Housekeepers Association Rose Melchert
- 2) (5 Passes) Executive Privilege for Senior Olympics Program - LoRayne Bargman

Mark Powless moved to approve both requests, Russell Metoxen seconded. Motion carried.

C. Stipends for AJNH Commission Board

Stipends are budgeted for next year, but not this year. Shirley Hill moved to defer to Finance & Appropriations, Mark Powless seconded. Motion carried.

D. Request for Approval of Operating Documents Pertaining to the Foreign Trade Zone - Wayne Skenandore

Wayne Skenandore gave an overview of the operating procedures for the Foreign Trade Zone. Francis Skenandore reviewed these documents and informed Mr. Skenandore that there would be not problems with legal ramifications or sovereign immunity. Wayne recommends that a change be made in that, instead of requiring one signature for authorization, there should be two.

Request for Approval of Operating Documents Pertaining to the Foreign Trade Zone

The proposed documents needing Business Committee Approval are:

a) Operating Agreement for the Zone - This document provides for the delegation of operating authority of the zone from Brown County (grantee) to Northeast Wisconsin Foreign Trade Zone Inc. (Administrator).

b) By-laws of NWFTZ - This document provides operational specifications for

the proposed Wisconsin Non-Profit Corporation.

c) Request for Proposal to secure a Foreign Trade zone Operator - This document provides specifications for the job of the Foreign Trade Zone operator and requests qualified applicants to apply.

Debbie Doxtator questioned the Sovereignty Clause. If the Tribe leases the property, the Sovereignty Clause will be included in the lease documents, not the original operating documents. Francis Skenandore will draft all lease documents.

After lengthy discussion, Wayne Skenandore stated he would send more supporting information if requested.

Russell Metoxen moved to approve the operating documents supporting the Foreign Trade Zone. Loretta Metoxen seconded. Motion carried.

Wayne Skenandore stated that a Tribal Representative is needed to sit on the Northeast Wisconsin Foreign Trade Zone, Inc (NWFTZ), which needs to be developed to make the zone operational. Brown County will then delegate operational authority to this non-profit Wisconsin corporation, and finally the NWFTZ will hire a zone operator to manage zone activities. Rick Hill delegated Wayne Skenandore to be the Tribal Representative for this organization, and bring a recommendation back to the Business Committee.

E. Possible FY 1991 Budget Sequestration - Deanna Beauman

Loretta Metoxen stated the definition of Sequestration is to cut back in steps.

According to the present projections of Congress and the Administration, if sequestration occurs, the non-defence reduction would 31.9% for all Federal Programs. This percentage would be applied to each program, project, and activity within an appropriation. If sequestration occurs, any funds lost would not be restored unless Congress takes specific action to do so and it is believed that restoration would not be likely.

The projected 31.9% is due to the large Federal budget deficit. Under the Gramm-Rudman-Hollings (GRH) Budget Deficit Reduction Act of 1988, each year Congress is to appropriate amounts consistent with predetermined deficit reduction levels. If Congress has not completed the appropriations process by September 30th, or if GRH mandated reduction levels have not been achieved once the appropriation bills have passed, sequestration is implemented.

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Possible FY 1991 Budget Sequestration (Continued)

Deanna Beauman is recommending the following action take place

- 1. The Business Committee send a letter to our Congressional delegation and the President of the United States urging them to completion of the FY 1991 appropriation bills for Federal programs and agreement on the FY 1991 budget. (The small gains we made in FY 1990 will certainly be wiped out if the project sequestration occurs).
- 2. That a letter be drafted for all Area Managers to send to our Congressional delegation and the President of the United States. (The potential loss of significant Federal program funds as result of sequestration would have an adverse impact on all of our Areas.

Loretta Metoxen moved to have Kathy King work with Deanna Beauman to develop a form letter for Chairman's signature and that another form letter be developed for all the Area Managers to use on how sequestration will affect our Tribe. Lloyd Powless seconded. Motion carried.

A. ORDE Advertising - Signs for C-Store - Sarah Plummer

Three different sign companies have been contacted for a bid, ORDE Advertising had best package.

Loretta Metoxen moved to approve the ORDE Advertising contract for a total of \$17,719.00, Debbie Doxtator seconded. Motion carried.

B. Contract with ORTEK for GSA Equipment - Thelma McLester

This equipment cannot be changed, altered or misused by either party.

The U.S. General Service's Administration (GSA) equipment cannot be released to anyone unless they are a contracting agency with the U.S. Government. In this Case ORTEK has agreed that this GSA Equipment will be used for education and training purposes. It is for this reason that the Higher Education Contract Funding under P.L. 638 is being released to ORTEK at this time and for this purpose.

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Contract with ORTEK for GSA Equipment (Continued)

It is agreed that at no time in the future, will ORTEK utilize this Tribal Contract Number under P.L. 638 - CTF 5055 3889, but that this is a one-time circumstance.

Mark Powless seconded. Motion carried.

Discussion on item C & D. Loretta Metoxen recommended all Business Committee Members attend the Sovereignty Conference, except those who are previously requested to attend to business here. Rick Hill suggested that the Business Committee also attend the Inter-Governmental Relations Conference.

Chairman Hill directed Loretta Metoxen to check into the funds available for Business Committee travel, and that this travel be deferred until a recommendation is available.

1. ORCOA Report - Lee McLester

Report on 8th National Indian Elders Conference held in Nashville, Tennessee.

ORCOA is requesting support of resolutions that were adopted and submitted at the Elders Conference. The resolutions are in regard to:

- a) Changing title from Native Americana to "North American Indians".
- b) Not to celebrate Columbus Day 1991
- c) Protect Social Security Trust Funds: Funds not to be used to pay the National Debt, now or in the future.

The above resolutions were also submitted to NCAI for their consideration at the forthcoming 1990 convention.

The bid to invite the 9th National Indian Elders Conference to the Oneida Reservation was successful. Preliminary planning with the Business Committee is requested as soon as possible.

This report is submitted for information at this time, and ORCOA would like to present it back to the Business Committee on next Friday's agenda, for formal action.
