GTC Resolution 06-16-14-A Adoption of Compensation for Judges for the Judiciary

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS,** on January 7, 2013 the Oneida General Tribal Council passed GTC Resolution 01-07-13-B adopting the Judiciary Law which created a new judiciary and directed that a family court be immediately created, and
- WHEREAS,** in accordance with the Judiciary Law, there shall be two (2) chief judges, three (3) trial court judges, and four (4) part-time appellate judges; and
- WHEREAS,** Section 150.11-10 (a) requires the compensation for judges to be initially established by resolution of the Oneida General Tribal Council and thereafter in accordance with the tribal budget process; and
- WHEREAS,** Section 150.11-10 (d) requires the part-time judges to receive a stipend for their services.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the wages for all judge positions shall be negotiable based on education and experience.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the annual wages for the judge positions shall be as follows:

Full-Time Trial Court Judges:	Minimum wage:	\$50,338
	Midpoint wage:	\$65,440
	Maximum wage:	\$80,541
Chief Judges:	Minimum wage:	\$57,889
	Midpoint wage:	\$75,255
	Maximum wage:	\$92,622
Part-Time Appellate Court Judges:	A stipend not to exceed the budgeted amount of \$45,240 annually per judge for 29 hours/week.
