"Belonging works two ways. You want to be there and people also want you to be there. Engaging is by choice, belonging just happens. You earn belonging."



Our Constitutional definition of "Oneida"

...is a person who has <u>1/4 or more</u>
 Oneida blood. This makes them eligible for enrollment.

 This fraction of blood is called your "blood quantum" or "blood degree."

The Problem: Blood quantum is NOT sustainable!



The Problem: Blood quantum is NOT sustainable!

 Fewer Oneida are being born who meet the 1/4 blood requirement for enrollment.


 If we follow this definition of Oneida, eventually there will be no "Oneida" eligible to enroll.

The Problem: Blood quantum is NOT sustainable!


• The last full-blood Oneida baby was enrolled in 2010.




New Oneida enrollments are *decreasing*Oneida deaths are *increasing*





Oneida enrollment will peak within the next five years, then steadily decline
