UPDATES

The Oneida Nation School System has received official notice of achieving Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) for the fifth consecutive year. Please see attached.

We congratulate Judge Denice Beans on her election to the tribal judiciary, Fawn Billie on her election to the Business Committee and Brian Doxtator on his new position in the Treasurer's Office. These now former school employees will be greatly missed.

The Oneida Nation School System has applied for and was accepted for the Community Eligibility Program, which provides free breakfast and lunch for all students attending the Oneida Nation School System on a reimbursement basis through the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction Food and Nutrition Services Program. This program requires a 4 year commitment.

Per budgetary directives, we will be working on reducing tribal contribution within the school system budget for FY 2015.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Our students continue to increase their knowledge of Oneida language and culture, as they attend language/culture and social dance classes as part of their daily education. Improving daily attendance and raising the reading and mathematics academic levels continue to be the overall goals for this school year.

The third year of a three year reading grant will continue with a focus on 6^{th} through 12^{th} grades. The technical assistance staff, Ms. Laura Lowe has emailed an action plan for review of staff and these requirements will be put into place for the 2014-15 school year.

MEETING REQUIREMENTS

The Oneida Nation School Board meets the first Monday of every month at 5:00 p.m. in the library at the Elementary School, and is open to the public. Special meetings are called by the School Board Chair when deemed necessary.

This letter is to inform you of the Bureau of Indian Education's (BIE) proposed Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) determination for your school, which is based on the documentation your school submitted for School Year (SY) 2012-2013.
