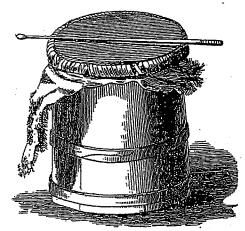

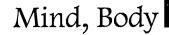

#### TIPS FOR SAFE AND HAPPY HOLIDAYS

This Holiday Season, don't let the spirit of giving lull you into giving burglars, muggers and pickpockets a better chance to do their dirty work. Crooks love the holidays as much as everyone else. But chiefly because it's an opportune time for crime.

Homes jam-packed with glittering gifts.. Stores, malls and downtown streets teeming with unsuspecting shoppers. People rushing around, stressed out and careless, looking for last minute gifts, trying to get everything done. It's enough to make a crook giddy with Holiday Joy. Here are some tips on how to celebrate safety this Holiday season

#### IF YOU'RE TRAVELING

- \*Get an automatic timer for your lights.
- \*Ask a neighbor to watch your home, shovel snow and park in the driveway from time to tome.
- \*Don't forget to have mail and newspaper delivery stopped. If it piles up, it's a sure sign you're gone.

#### IF YOU'RE OUT FOR THE EVENING

- \*Turn on lights and a radio or TV so it looks like someone's home.
- \*Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave, even if it's just for a few minutes.
- \*Don't display gifts where they can be seen from outside.

#### IF YOU'RE SHOPPING

- \*Stay alert and be aware of what's going on around you.
- \*Park in a well lighted space and be sure to lock the car, close the windows and hide shopping bags and gifts in the trunk.
- \*Avoid carrying large amounts of cash, pay with a check or credit card whenever possible..
- \*Deter pickpockets and purse snatchers. Don't overburden yourself with packages. Be extra careful with purses and wallets. Carry a purse close to your body, not dangling by the straps. Put a wallet in an inside coat or front pants pocket.

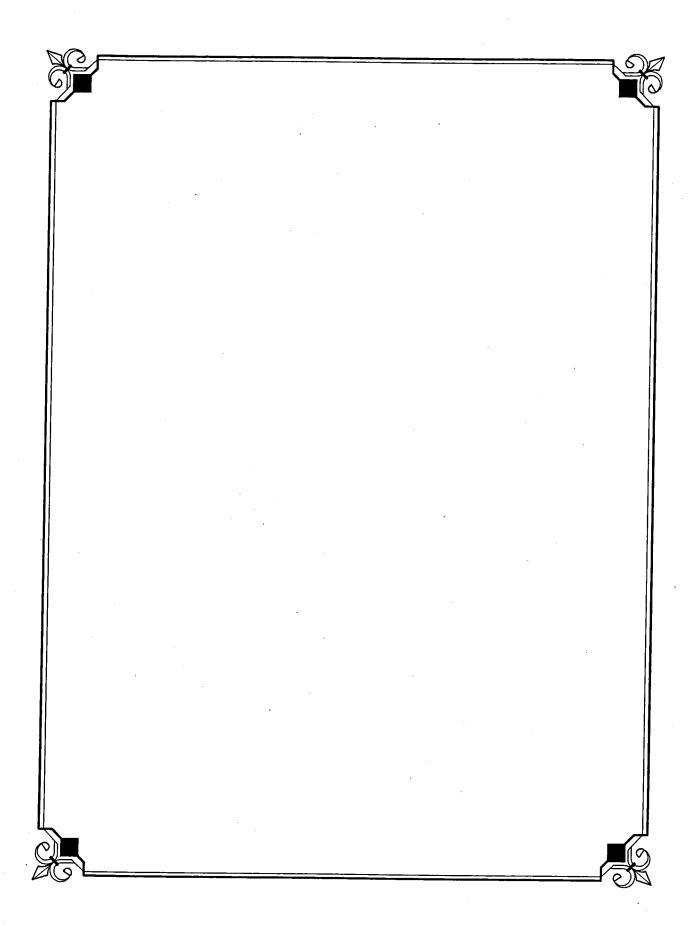

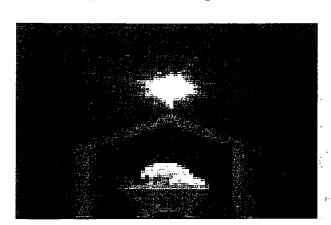

#### **CHRISTMASTIME**

Christmastime is green and red And candy canes and gingerbread And carols sung with voices joyful, Stockings hung, all stuffed and toyful; Cards addressed at kitchen tables.

Christmastime is faces glowing; Sidewalk Santas ho-ho-ho-ing; Streets and stores all thickly peoples; Music chimed from churches steepled; Plays and pageants, lines forgotten, Bright foil wings, and beads of cotton.

Christmastime is wrapped in wonder;
Piles of presents stacked under
Christmas trees, so green and piney,
Dressed their best in tinsel shiny;

#### GRANNY'S BOILED CHRISTMAS CUSTARD

3 whole eggs, well beaten ½ cup granulated sugar 1/4 teaspoon of salt 1 quart of milk 1 teaspoon of vanilla extract

In a medium bowl, combine eggs, sugar, and salt. Set aside. I a double boiler over boiling water, scald the milk. Add a small amount of milk to egg mixture and stir .Gradually add egg mixture to milk, stirring constantly. Cook until the mixture is thick enough to coat the back of a wooden spoon, about 20 minutes. Add vanilla extract. Cool and refrigerate until ready to serve. Makes 4 cups. Recipe may be doubled.

#### **CINNAMON STICKS**

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. In a large bowl, combine 1 cup softened butter, 2 or 3 tablespoon granulated sugar, 2 level teaspoons cinnamon, 1 tablespoon almond extract, and 2 1/2cups all purpose flour. Knead mixture. Separate the dough into 24 pieces; roll each piece in a 1 ½ inch stick. Roll each stick in granulated sugar. Bake 30 to 35 minutes on an ungreased cookie sheet. Makes 24 servings .

#### MINCE MEAT COFFEECAKE

Preheat oven to 370 degrees F. In a large bowl, sift together 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour, 3/4 cup granulated sugar, and 2 teaspoons baking powder. Using a pastry blender, cut in 1/3 cup margarine. Add 1 slightly beaten egg, 1/4 cup milk, and 3/4 cup mincemeat; stir well. Spoon mixture into a greased ring mold. Bake for 30 minutes; remove cake from the pan and cool on a wire rack. Combine 1 tablespoon milk with enough powdered sugar to create a glaze. Drizzle the glaze over the cake. Makes 12 servings.

#### MOCHA CINNAMON COCOA

In a large bowl, combine 2 cups dry chocolate milk mix, 2 1/4 cups sifted powdered sugar, 2 cups instant nonfat dry milk powder, 2 cups powdered non- dairy coffee creamer, 3/4 cup instant coffee granules and 3 tablespoons ground cinnamon. Stir well.

Dry mixture keeps up to 3 months in an airtight container at room temperature. To serve, place 1/4 cup of mixture in a mug and add 3/4 cup boiling water; stir well. Garnish with whipped cream and sprinkle with ground cinnamon. One recipe makes 32 servings.

#### HEART ATTACK PROCEDURE": (THIS IS NOT A JOKE!)

Women should know that not every heart attack symptom is going to be the left arm hurting. Be aware of intense pain in the jaw line. You may never have the first chest pain during the course of a heart attack. Nausea and intense sweating are also common symptoms. 60% of people who have a heart attack while they are asleep do not wake up. It's pain unlike anything you've ever experienced before. Given a choice between natural child birth and a heart attack, pain-wise, it's much easier to have a baby. Let's be careful and be aware. The more we know, the better chance we could survive...

Let's say it's 6.15pm and you're driving home (alone of course), after an unusually hard day on the job. You're tired, upset and frustrated. Suddenly you start experiencing severe pain in your chest that starts to radiate out into your arm and up into your jaw. You are only about five miles from the hospital nearest your home. Unfortunately, you don't know if you'll be able to make it that far. You have been trained in CPR, but the guy that taught the course did not tell you how to perform it on yourself.

#### "HOW TO SURVIVE A HEART ATTACK WHEN ALONE":

Since many people are alone when they suffer a heart attack, without help, the person whose heart is beating improperly and who begins to feel faint, has only about 10 seconds left before losing consciousness. However, these victims can help themselves by coughing repeatedly and very vigorously.

A deep breath should be taken before each cough, and the cough must be deep and prolonged, as when producing sputum from deep inside the chest.

A breath and a cough must be repeated about every two seconds without let-up until help arrives, or until the heart is felt to be beating normally again.

Deep breaths get oxygen into the lungs and coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating.

The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it regain normal rhythm. In this way, heart attack victims can get to a hospital. Tell as many other people as possible about this. It could save their lives!! "
