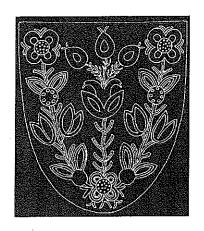
"Common Symptoms of Frontotemporal Disorders"

Frontotemporal disorder symptoms aren't consistent person to person. Much like other neurological diseases, presentation is unique. The symptom presentation is directly correlated to what part of the brain is affected. Entire pieces of tissue from the frontal and or temporal region of the brain may be absent in relation to the disease process. Generally, with the brain damage noted in the frontal region of the brain we will see behavioral symptoms. Changes in the temporal lobe present as language or emotional disorders. There is no way to quantify behaviors related to this disorder. That is, they can vary significantly and range from mild to quite bizarre, and unsafe. Some behaviors that may be noted are neglecting personal care, inability to prioritize, compulsive behaviors including shoplifting, displaying socially inappropriate behaviors such as laughing at a funeral, language disorders may include being able to speak normally but the person cannot use or understand the words to say, very often the person affected with disease lacks awareness of the disease, depression, falls, tremors, shuffling gait and abnormal posture. Again there is no way to quantify the scope of behaviors that may be seen as each person's brain is unique.

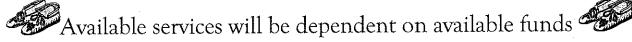


Oneida Elder Services Native American Family Care Giver "Voucher" Program

Oneida Elder Services is pleased to announce a new Native American Family Caregiver "Voucher" Program. It is designed to give established caregivers the opportunity to receive up to 4 hours a month of temporary respite relief from their caregiving responsibilities. Qualifications:

- "Temporary Relief Respite Caregiver Worker" are as follows:
- 1. Relief Respite Caregiver Worker must be Age 18 years or older.
- 2. Must be pre-approved by Oneida Elder Services.
- 3. Must have a pre-approved background check with Oneida Tribe of Indians Human Resources Department.
- 4. Completed and Approved "NAFCG Provider Agreement form".
- 5. Applicant must be familiar with e recipient and their situation. This is to be determined by the recognized established Family Caregiver.

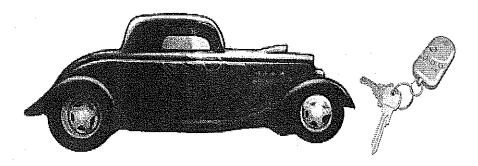
Grandparents 55 years or older, who have custody or guardianship of grandchildren, you may qualify for the program.

Oneida Elder Services <u>will</u> be having "AARP Drivers Safety Program" Next spring in May, 2012

"AARP Driver Safety Program" is a refresher driving course designed for older adults. One learns how to make driving safer, more comfortable, and more worry-free for one's self, the family who loves you and others on the road who depend on your driving abilities. The course is provided by AARP and is conducted by certified volunteer instructors.

The class runs for one/ four hour session, focusing on problems unique to older drivers. These include physical changes in eyesight, hearing, and reaction time which normally happen as people age. The instructors lead participants through a review of basic laws and patterns that may have changed since older drivers got their first license.

The goal of the program is to keep older drivers behind the wheel longer and more safely. It is difficult for the average driver to keep up with changes in traffic and related driving situations unless the individual takes a driving improvement course such as this. One example would be the additions of many "Round-Abouts". Some insurance companies <u>may</u> give a discount on insurance premiums for those taking the course. No tests are involved. The course is conducted in a classroom setting and there are no behind the wheel tests.

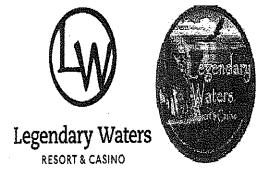

Elder Scams

As people become elders they are more likely to become targets of con artist who will attempt to target their "nest eggs" and assets.

Following are some of the telemarketing scams that may not be legitimate and target our elder population:

Free prizes

- · Low cost vitamins
- Free health care products
- or low cost vacations

If a telemarketer tells you that you must:

- "Act now or this offer will not be good."
- "You have won a prize but you must pay shipping or handling fees."
- "You must send money, give a credit card number, bank account number, or have money picked up by a courier."

- "You don't need to check out our company we are completely legitimate and have been doing business for 20 years."
- 'You don't want to risk losing out on this no risk and high profit offer."

Most <u>legitimate</u> businesses <u>do not mind giving you references</u> and time to verify the accuracy of the information that they give you. And they will be willing to mail you information about the charity, investment or purchase.

Beware of any telemarketer who offers to send a courier to pick up money. Once your money has been given you probably have no business address should you need to recover it.

If you become the victim of fraud <u>immediately contact your local</u>, <u>State or Federal Law Enforcement Agency to report it</u>. A complaint is much more difficult to investigate if not reported immediately because details of important information may be forgotten.

- 8) Favorite Meal:

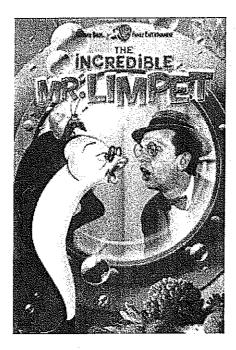
 My favorite meal is Turkey a la King, right after the holidays.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF VALENTINE'S DAY



Saint Valentine February 14 269 A.D.

Valentine was a holy priest in Rome who, with St. Marius and his family, assisted the martyrs in the persecution under Claudius II. He was apprehended by the emperor to make him renounce his faith, commended him to be beaten with clubs, and afterwards, to be beheaded, which was executed on February 14th ...this was also a designated a feast day (until 1969, when it was dropped from the Roman Catholic calendar) to honor two Christian saints (at least one named Saint Valentine) martyred by the Roman Emperor. There is a little bit of love stuff in this part, though the reason Saint Valentine was killed (beheaded, actually) was that he continued to marry young couples even though Claudius forbade it. Apparently Claudius thought that married soldiers weren't as good as single soldiers.
