Grass cutting & Snow plowing

Oneida Elderly Services and Senior Center will be providing monthly articles in the Drums Across Oneida of the services we provide along with the basic guidelines. This month article is on grass cutting & snow plowing. Next month article will be on congregate and home delivered meals. We hope this gives community members a better understanding of the services we provide.

In 1994 (ONCOA) Oneida Nation Commission on Aging a nine (9) member elected advisory board to Elderly Services/Senior Center took action to establish a priority of serving older & disabled adults. Services are provided based on age priority, staffing and funding availability. Some services are solely for Oneida enrolled elders only.

Priority:

- 1) 70 years and older.
- 2) 55 to 69 years who are disabled/handicapped and living alone.
- 3) 55 to 69 with serious health or safety issues. Our service area is

Brown & Outagamie Counties within the Oneida Reservation Boundaries. For all service request please contact our Service Coordinator, Cheryl Ault @ (920)869-2448.

We provide grass cutting and snow plowing services to Oneida enrolled elders who own their own home. We have two teams of two (2) and currently we have 75 elders on are grass cutting service. Grass cutting service begins in the spring when the ground is dry and is done on a rotation basis only.

Snow plowing starts with the first measurable snow fall of three (3) inches or more. Snow plowing teams are out plowing as early as 4:00am for Oneida

elders on lifeline, dialysis, and/or the age 70 years and older. There may be times when the snow plowing teams will come and clear a path for emergency vehicles and will return later to finish. We currently serve 105 elders and snow plowing is done based on priority.

Priority for snow plowing:

- 1) Lifeline & Dialysis clients.
- 2) 70 years and older.
- 3) Disabled/handicapped and serious health issues.

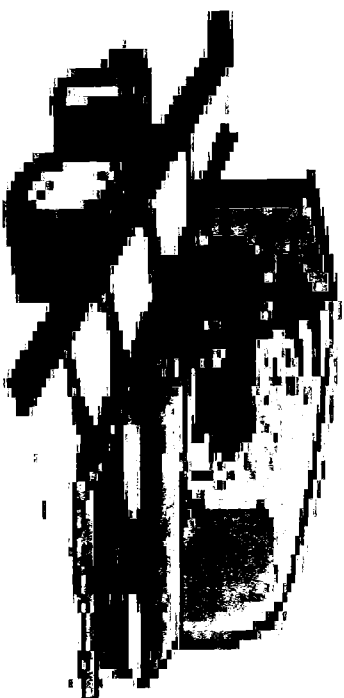

We provide grass cutting and snow plowing services to Oneida enrolled elders who own their own home. We have two teams of two (2) and currently we have 75 elders on are grass cutting service. Grass cutting service begins in the spring when the ground is dry and is done on a rotation basis only.

Snow plowing starts with the first measurable snow fall of three (3) inches or more. Snow plowing teams are out plowing as early as 4:00am for Oneida elders on lifeline, dialysis, and/or the age 70 years and older. There maybe times when the snow plowing teams will come and clear a path for emergency vehicles and will return later to finish. We currently serve 105 elders and snow plowing is done based on priority.

Priority for snow plowing:

- 1) Lifeline & Dialysis clients.**
- 2) 70 years and older.**
- 3) Disabled/handicapped and serious health issues.**
