Application for Admission to Practice

In the interest and quality of justice within the Oneida Nation’s court system, and the protection of individual litigants’ rights before the Trial, Family, and Court of Appeals, any attorney or lay-person must be reviewed and formally approved for Admission to Practice before the Oneida Judiciary. (Pursuant to OCL 801.9-1 and 806.9-1)

The following is required to complete process:

FOR ATTORNEYS

(Check when Completed)

	1.	Your completed application
	2.	Submit the one-time application fee of \$100.00 (cash, check, money order, credit/debit card)
	3.	Include Certificate of Good Standing from State Bar or Supreme Court from the state in which you are duly licensed to practice law, and
	4.	Include relevant educational and/or professional background information. Note: you may attach a resume’ or statement of education and professional experience.

FOR LAY ADVOCATES

(Check when Completed)

	1.	Your completed application
	2.	Submit the one-time application fee of \$50.00 (cash, check, money order, credit/debit card)
	3.	Submit a Personal Affidavit of Qualification
	4.	Include Two (2) Affidavits supporting qualification from a qualified associate with your application.
	5.	Include a copy of your Certificate of Completion of your paralegal training or other advocacy program if applicable, and
	6.	Include relevant educational and/or professional background information. Note: you may attach a resume’ or statement of education and professional experience.
