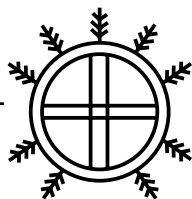

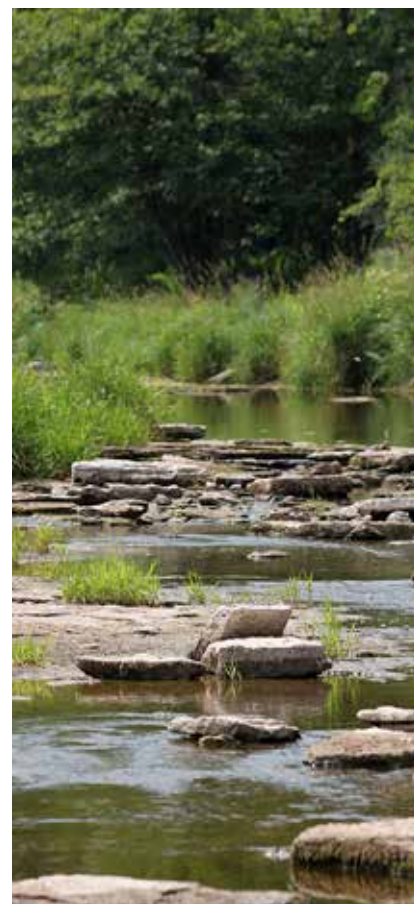
We are currently transitioning to a new database system. To ensure best customer service, departments will be handling their own registration. We apologize for any inconvenience and thank you for your patience.

### REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Our programs are offered at a fraction of the actual costs and significantly less than the average cost of similar programs in the Green Bay area because of funding from tribal contributions, grants, fees collected.

1. **Payment Policy:** All fees and paperwork must be paid in full by cash, check, or debit/credit card at the time of registration in order to reserve a spot in programs and classes.
2. **Waiting Lists:** If a class is full, you will automatically be placed on a waiting list. We will contact you if a space becomes available before the start of class.
3. **Cancellation Policy:** Register early. Some activities have limited availability and fill quickly. If classes do not have a minimum number of registrants a week before class starts, the class may be cancelled. A full refund or credit will be given for any cancelled classes.
4. **Refunds Policy:** Except in the case of a class cancellation or building closure, refunds are not available.

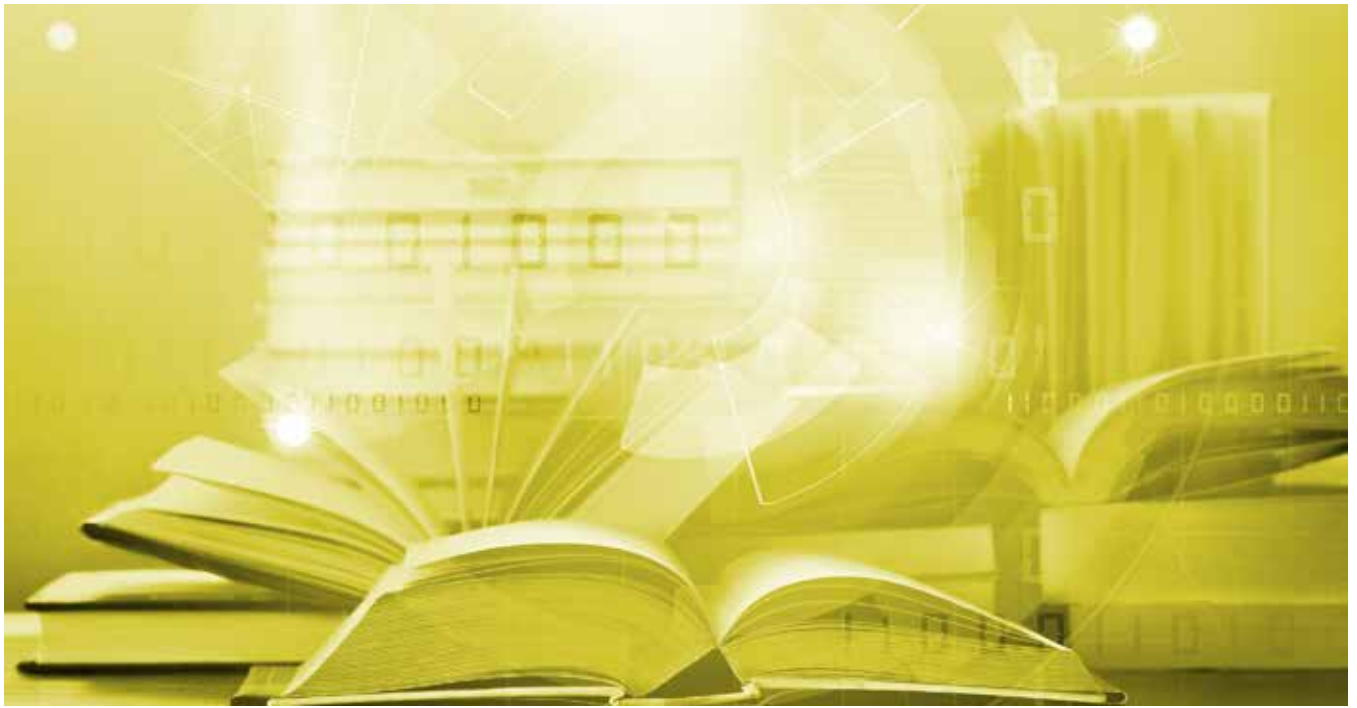

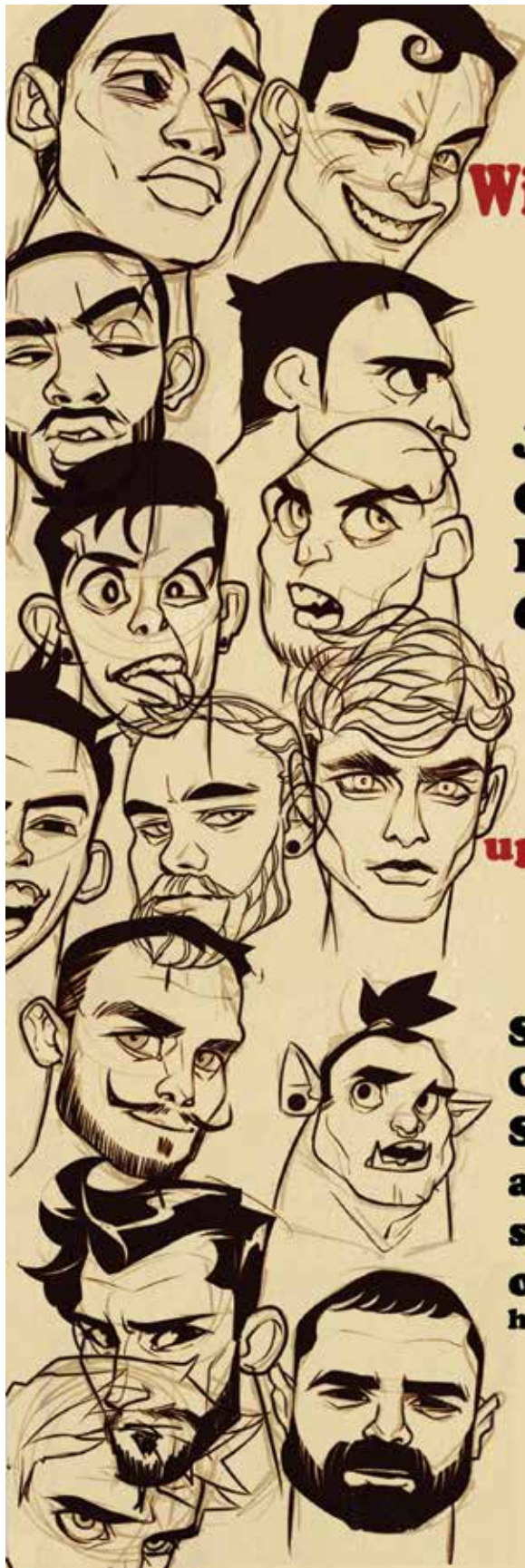

Capture the awakening of color and the warmth of spring by painting the Rez. Short demonstrations will begin each session benefiting the beginner as well as the advanced student. Participants will learn how to paint clouds, trees, water and flowers. Basic supplies are included in the class fee; however, you may want to bring a chair. Each week you will be painting at a different location. If it's raining, you will be painting indoors. Meet in the Arts Program cottage.

## Basket Making: Tray/Organizer Basket

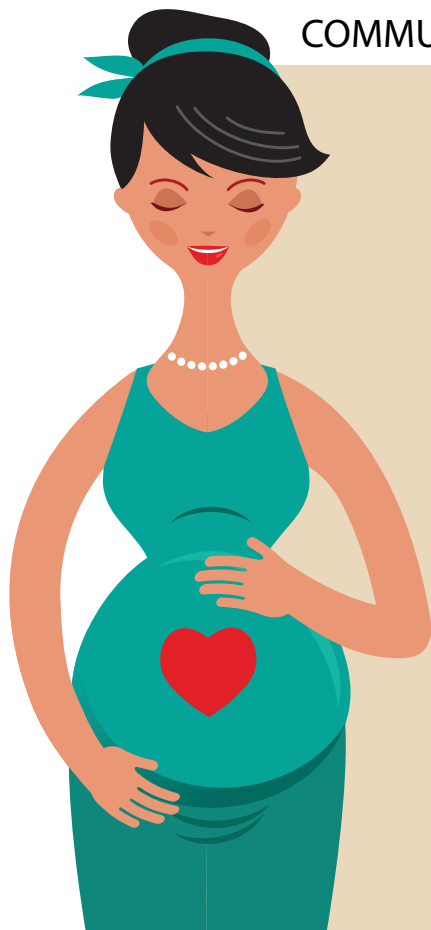
