- 4. Prepare and submit and implement of lesson plans utilizing the Oneida Language and obtain the materials necessary for effective presentations.
- 5. Provide instruction for the proper use of traditional musical instruments to students and teachers.
- 6. Prepare and maintain a file containing pertinent information for a substitute teacher.
- 7. Maintain appropriate daily records of students as required including grades, attendance and behavior.
- 8. Attend assigned school activities outside of the regular school day, supervise classrooms, lunchroom and outside activities, attend in-service training and enforce the rules/procedures of the Participates in the Oneida Nation Teacher Certification Program.
- 9. Maintain professional and technical knowledge by attending seminars, educational workshops, classes and conferences; reviewing professional publications; establishing networks; participating in professional societies.
- 10. Adhere to all Tribal Personnel Policies and Procedures, Tribal Standard Operating Procedures, and Area and Program Strategic Plans and Policies.
- 11. Maintain strict department security, confidentiality, and quality to meet professional standards of the department.
