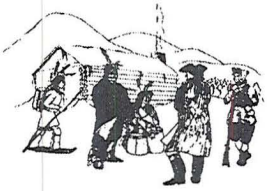


# Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

## BC Resolution 03-23-11-E *Adoption of Building Code*

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS,** on July 21, 1993, the Oneida Business Committee adopted the City of Green Bay's Building Code in order to ensure that quality construction would occur on the Reservation until the Tribe adopted a Building Code specific for the Oneida Reservation; and
- WHEREAS,** the Building Code adopted in 1993 has not been amended since its original adoption; and
- WHEREAS,** a work group was formed to draft a new building code and was comprised of representatives from the General Manager's Office, Zoning Department, Engineering Department, and the Legislative Reference Office; and
- WHEREAS,** the new Building Code updates, clarifies and streamlines many provisions found in the current law and incorporates specific standards from the state codes, which adopt and modify international codes based on regional conditions; and
- WHEREAS,** a public hearing was held on November 18, 2010 for adoption of the Building Code, in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the attached Building Code is hereby adopted.
