BC Resolution # <u>7-3-07-A</u> Amendments to the Hall of Fame Ordinance

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of the Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Hall of Fame Ordinance was adopted by the Oneida Business Committee by passage of resolution BC-6-16-04-D to provide a formal, standardized means by which to recognize the personal achievements of Oneidas; and
- WHEREAS, it is necessary to reconstitute the Hall of Fame Selection Committee (Selection Committee) because of the lack of community interest in serving on the Selection Committee as originally presented; and
- WHEREAS, under the amendments attached to this resolution, the Selection Committee would consist of one Oneida Business Committee member, one appointed Tribal member, and the Quality Leadership Team, which is comprised of the Area Managers and Key Directors from all the service areas of the Governmental Services Division; and
- WHEREAS, only those members of the Quality Leadership Team who are Tribal members or those members of the Quality Leadership Team who are spouses of Tribal members may serve on the Hall of Fame Selection Committee; and
- WHEREAS, the amendments received a public hearing in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act on May 15, 2007.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby adopts the attached amendments to the Hall of Fame Ordinance.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Office

The proposed amendments change the make up of the Hall of Fame Selection Committee because of the lack of community interest in serving on the Hall of Fame Selection Committee as originally presented.

The Committee, under the current law, consists of nine Oneida Tribal members. Under the proposed law, the Committee will consist of one Oneida Business Committee member, one appointed Tribal member, and the Quality Leadership Team which is comprised of ten members.

The Quality Leadership Team is comprised of the Area Managers and Key Directors from all of the service areas of the Governmental Services Division - Fitness, Recreation, Arts, Veterans, Community Education, Social Services, Education & Training, Cultural Heritage, Transit and the GSD Division Office - for a total of ten members.

It is required in the law that each representative of the Quality Leadership Team be either a Tribal member or married to a Tribal member. In the event that a Quality Leadership Team member is not a Tribal member or married to a Tribal member, a designee from the appropriate department who is a Tribal member is allowed to fulfill the role as a Selection Committee member under this law. It is not the intention of the law to restructure or change the composition of the Quality Leadership Team in any way.

The time frames for completing tasks were minimized or removed in order to allow flexibility for the Selection Committee.

The record keeping provisions were clarified, so that the Section Committee is only required to submit documentation for those individuals being inducted to the Tribal Secretary's Office. All other applications and documentation will be retained or disposed of by the Director.

The law has been formatted to comply with the Format for Laws and a public hearing was held on May 15, 2007.

83.1. Purpose and Policy

41 83.1-1. *Purpose*. The purpose of this law is to give recognition to those Oneidas, both historically 42 and in the modern era, who excelled in the fields of academics, sports or other personal achievement, 43 by paying tribute to these persons by enshrining their names and achievements into the Oneida Hall 44 of Fame. Inductees into the Hall of Fame should have distinguished themselves and brought honor 45 to the Oneida people by being a consistent representative of good character and high standard of 46 conduct.

47 83.1-2. *Policy*. The policy of this law is to have a consistent methodology for induction into the

50 83.2. Adoption, Amendment and Repeal

83.2-1. This law was adopted by the Oneida Business Committee by resolution BC# 6-16-04-D and
 amended by BC#

83.2-2. This law may be amended pursuant to the procedures set out in the Oneida Administrative
 Procedures Act by the Oneida Business Committee or the Oneida General Tribal Council.

83.2-3. Should a provision of this law or the application thereof to any person or circumstances be
held as invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions of this law which are considered to
have legal force without the invalid portions.

- 83.2-4. Any law, policy, regulation, rule, resolution, or motion, or portion thereof, which directly
 conflicts with the provisions of this law is hereby repealed to the extent that it is inconsistent with
 or is contrary to this law.

64 **83.3. Definitions**

83.3-1. This section shall govern the definitions of words and phrases used within this law. All
 words not defined herein shall be used in their ordinary and everyday sense.

(a) "Director" means the Director of the Oneida Nation Museum or a person designated by the Cultural Heritage Department.

(

(b) "Hall of Fame" means the Oneida Hall of Fame.

(c) "Historic Era Nominee" means an enrolled Oneida elder, or a deceased person of verifiable Oneida ancestry, whose record in either academics, sports or personal achievement was established a minimum of 25 years prior to being nominated.

(d) "Modern Era Nominee" means an enrolled Oneida, either living or deceased, whose
record in either academics, sports or personal achievement was established a minimum of
five (5) years prior to being nominated.

- (e) "Quality Leadership Team" means, for the purposes of this law, the Area Managers and
 Key Directors from all the service areas of the Government Service Division. However, only
 those members of the Quality Leadership Team who are Tribal members or those members
 of the Quality Leadership Team who are spouses of Tribal members may serve on the Hall
 of Fame Selection Committee. A Tribal member designee shall substitute for the non-spouse
 or non-Tribal member for the purpose of carrying out the selection responsibilities of this law
 but is not intended to replace that member of the Quality Leadership Team.
- (f) "Selection Committee" means the Oneida Hall of Fame Selection Committee which shall
 be responsible for selecting inductees for the Hall of Fame on a tri-annual basis.

87 83.4-1. In accordance with this law, the Oneida Tribe on a tri-annual basis, may induct into the Hall
88 of Fame three (3) Modern Era and three (3) Historic Era nominees into the Oneida Hall of Fame at
