Mission:


We provide for all families a caring and nurturing environment through the incorporation of the Oneida Culture and the use of developmentally appropriate practices that supports the individual development of all children.




Hand Foot & Mouth Disease


Hand-foot-and-mouth disease, is caused by a virus. Symptoms include ulcers, or sores, inside or around the mouth, and a rashor blisters on the hands, feet, legs, or buttocks. And while it's not pleasant, it also is not serious.

Anyone can get the disease, but children under age 10 are most likely to catch it. You can take steps to ease the symptoms while it runs its course, though.

Hand-foot-and-mouth disease should go away on its own after 7 to 10 days. There is no treatment for the illness and no vaccine. You can ease your child's symptoms with: Over-the-counter pain relievers like ibuprofen (Advil) or acetaminophen (Tylenol) or numbing mouth sprays. Don't use aspirin for pain -- it can cause serious illness in children. Cold treats like Popsicles, yogurt, or smoothies soothe a sore throat.

Your child is most contagious in the first 7 days. But the virus can stay in her body for days or weeks after symptoms go away and it could spread through her spit or poop. The best way to prevent that is to wash hands thoroughly. That applies to you, too, after you change a diaper or wipe a runny nose. Your child should be feverand symptom-free before she goes back to daycare.
