DECISION

This case has come before the Oneida Tribal Judicial System, Trial Court. Judicial Officers; Mary Adams, Jean M. Webster, and Leland Wigg-Ninham, presiding.

I Background

This case involves a Temporary Injunction against Respondent to immediately cease and desist from any activity associated with any renovations listed within the contract.

On July 20, 2012 Petitioner filed his complaint alleging he and Respondent entered into an agreement for home renovations. The work was completed. Petitioner claims all that was needed is Respondent's signature before the check for labor could be issued to Petitioner for remainder of the home renovation costs. The remaining balance due is \$9,551.55. Petitioner alleges Respondent refuses to sign off on the final payment, which has cost Petitioner financial hardship because he was required to cover out-of-pocket expenses for insurance, building permits and payroll.

A deliberation hearing was scheduled for Monday, July 23, 2012.

On July 23, 2012 Petitioner submitted a motion to drop complaint. The Court grants Petitioner's motion to dismiss in accordance with Rule 14(A), the party making the claim may file a notice of dismissal and that claim shall be deemed dismissed without prejudice.

II Decision

The Court grants Petitioner's motion to dismiss without prejudice.
