DECISION

Petitioner's Motion for an Injunction

This case has come before the Oneida Tribal Judicial System, Trial Court. Judicial Officers: Jean M. Webster, Kathy Hughes, and Sandra Skenadore, presiding.

Background

On November 10, 2014, Petitioner Benjamin Cannon filed a petition asking for an Injunction on the November 22, 2014 Special Election and that the Oneida Business Committee vacancy be filled with the person receiving the highest votes from the July 2014 elections.

On November 11, 2014, the Trial Court held a deliberation. The Court issued a decision giving the Petitioner five (5) business days to perfect his filing. The Petitioner had until November 25, 2014 to file the perfected filing.

On December 1, 2014, the Lead Judicial Officer was informed the Petitioner had not filed the perfected filing; therefore, the Court dismisses the Petitioners claim for failure to file the

perfected claim by November 25, 2014 as ordered in the decision on November 18, 2014.

Decision

Petitioner's case dismissed without prejudice.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
