FINAL ORDER

This case has come before the Oneida Trial Court, Honorable Patricia Ninham Hoeft presiding.

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

On July 17, 2020, Defendant was issued a citation for Failure to Comply with Ordered Quarantine in accordance with the Oneida Nation's Domestic Animal Law, section 304.7-6, *Investigations for Suspected Animal Bites*. At a hearing on September 17, 2020, Petitioner motioned to extend the hearing to ensure proper service on Defendant and to amend the citation violation to 304.6-6. The court granted Petitioner's requests. At a hearing on November 19, 2020 at 9:00 a.m., Petitioner conferenced with Defendant. Both parties agreed the fine would be reduced to \$25.00 and court costs \$25.00, totaling \$50.00. The Court accepted the agreement.

FINDING OF FACTS

1. The Court has subject matter, personal and territorial jurisdiction over this matter.
2. On July 17, 2020, the Oneida Police Department issued a citation for violation of 3 O.C. 304.7-6.
 - a. On September 17, 2020, the court granted Petitioner's motion to amend the citation violation to 304.6-6.
3. Notice was provided to all those entitled to receive notice.
4. A hearing was held on November 19, 2020 at 9:00 a.m.
5. During the hearing, the parties agreed to a stipulation as follows:
 - a. Fine: \$25.00
 - b. Court costs: \$25.00
6. The stipulation is reasonable.

ORDER

1. The above stipulation is approved.
2. Defendant shall pay to the Oneida Judiciary within 30 days from the date this order is signed:

Fine:	\$ 25.00
<u>Court costs:</u>	<u>\$ 25.00</u>
Total:	\$ 50.00
