Work in Tehatiw[^]nakhwa Language Nest (TLN) or Oneida Language Department (OLD) attend (virtual) language classes (25%), helping put home kits together (15%), observe and assist instructors with daily lessons (10%), helping set up classrooms (20%), assist in Facebook live, Youtube and/or other social media language lessons and resources (15%) and other projects i.e. garden, making cultural arts and crafts (15%)

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS/WORK ENVIRONMENT
