### STATEMENT OF THE CASE

The Defendant was issued a citation for an animal running at large, first offense.

### FINDING OF FACTS

- 1. The Court has subject matter, personal and territorial jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Defendant received proper notice.
- 3. On November 15, 2020 the Oneida Police Department issued a citation for violation of 3 O.C. 304.6-4, Animal Running at Large; the violation occurred on November 6, 2020.
- 4. A pre-trial citation hearing was held on February 18, 2021, at 9:00 a.m.
- 5. At the pre-trial citation hearing, the Court read the rights listed on the Acknowledgement of Rights Form to the Defendant and Defendant responded that she understood her rights.
- 6. At the pre-trial citation hearing, Defendant entered a plea to contest the citation.
- 7. At the pre-trial citation hearing, the Court granted time for the parties to work out a settlement.
- 8. On March 10, 2021, the Petitioner filed confirmation of a settlement.
  - a. The dog was surrendered on or about November 6, 2020 to the Bay Area Humane Society.
- 9. The settlement is reasonable.

#### **ORDER**

- 1. The settlement is approved.
- 2. The fine shall be reduced to \$0.00.
- 3. Court costs shall be waived.
