WHEREAS,	the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Former John R. and Charlene S. Everett Property
WHEREAS,	the parcel is described as follows: Legal Description: See attached. Tax Parcel Numbers: 17-0-1708-00, 17-0-1709-00, 17-0-1710-00, 17-0-1711-00, 17-0-1712-00, 17- 0-1713-00, 17-0-1716-00, 17-0-1724-00, 17-0-1725-00
WHEREAS,	the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing residential and agricultural land use, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
