WHEREAS,	the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida
	Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS,	the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:

WHEREAS,	the parcel is described as follows:
