WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Former Anthony F. Chambers and Thomas F. Chambers Property

WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:
Legal Description: See attached.
Tax Parcel Numbers: HB-1405, HB-1406, HB-1420

WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing residential land use, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

All of Indian Claim 192, and part of Indian Claims 193 and 198, in Sections 26 and 35, Township 24 North, Range 19 East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin, more fully described as follows:

Beginning at the Northwesterly Corner of Indian Claim 191, Brown County Surveyor's Monument #U/V-19/20(2); thence North 53° 36' 41" East, 440.00 feet to a point being South 53° 36' 41" West, 114 feet more or less from the centerline of the Duck Creek River, being the start of a meander line; thence North 30° 32' 27" West, 825.80 feet along said meander line; thence North 85° 01' 59" West 540.04 feet along said meander line; thence South 52° 02' 43" West, 161.57 feet along said meander line; thence North 0° 43' 53" West, 203.00 feet to the end of said meander line; thence continuing North 0° 43' 53" West, 346.15 feet to the Southerly right-of-way of the Fox Valley & Western LTD Railroad; thence 1432.52 feet along the arc of a 2802.97 foot radius curve to the left whose long chord bears South 68° 09' 00" West, 1416.98 feet; thence South 0° 08' 07" West, 482.56 feet; thence South 89° 38' 46" East, 390.00 feet to a point being North 89° 38' 46" West, 82 feet more or less from the Duck Creek River and the start of a meander line; thence North 28° 27' 18" East, 394.53 feet along said meander line; thence North 66° 44' 06" East, 808. 51 feet along said meander line; thence South 0° 43' 53" East, 203.00 feet along said meander line; thence South 52° 02' 43" West, 554.43 feet along said meander line; thence South 50° 13' 48" West, 854.31 feet along said meander line; thence South 17° 33' 14" East, 677.47 feet along said meander line; thence South 21° 23' 52" West, 571.18 feet along said meander line to a point being South 87° 03' 44" East, 246 feet more or less from the centerline of the Duck Creek River and the end of said meander line; thence South 87° 03' 44" East, 990.00 feet; thence North 35° 04' 31" East, 1461.78 feet to the point of beginning.

Said parcel contains 99.82 acres more or less, including all lands lying between the meander line and the centerline of the Duck Creek River
