- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is aware of the Ten Leading Health Indicators for the nation's health with number one being the need for physical activity which we would like to provide innovative and physical activities for our youth that encourage movement and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is aware of the second Leading Health Indicator for the nations health is overweight and obesity and by providing education promoting a healthy nutrition and lifestyle we will have a positive impact on future generations of the Tribe.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits a grant application to the Department of Health and Human Service Office of Clinical and Preventive Services; Children and Youth Projects to help bring a healthy and nutritious lifestyle to our Nations youth.
