WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Former Donald H. Wishart and Alvira M. Wishart Property

WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:

WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base

and provide an existing residential housing land use and will not be used for gaming
