WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has identified Education as one of our national priorities, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin continues to support the education of Oneida Nation youth by encouraging innovative teaching techniques which are culturally sensitive and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits a grant application to the Institute of Museum and Library Services: 2002 Native American Basic Library Services to continue on-going efforts of the Oneida Nation School System.
