RESOLUTION # 3-20-02-B

Oneida Nation School System/Wisconsin DPI/Wisconsin Food Safe School Program

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe has determined as part of its Seventh Generation Commitment, "To develop a provisional system that fits our "family"/community values such as food, shelter, clothing and education as well as other services," and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Nation School System for its most cherished responsibility-education of our children-to renew and revitalize the dignity of and harmony amongst Oneida People, in accordance with Oneida's need for cultural survival and wellbeing, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Family and Community will be strengthened by providing critically needed services that will have a positive impact on the health and wellbeing of our children.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin/Oneida Nation School System in collaboration with the State of Wisconsin/Department of Public Instruction/Wisconsin Food Safe School Program, authorizes and submits this grant application for the purpose of securing external monies to create a community-based, multi-disciplinary team to plan, develop, implement and evaluate a written school food safety policy based on the Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines.
