WHEREAS,	the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV., Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Screening Committee has presented a Pardon Petition on behalf of
WHEREAS,	the requirements of the Oneida Pardon Ordinance and Oneida Pardon Procedures Policy have been fulfilled, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Screening Committee hereby recommends <u>DENYING</u> the pardon petition of <u>JASON KING</u> , Petitioner.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: The Oneida Business Committee by this resolution hereby:

DENIES the Pardon of <u>JASON KING</u>, Petitioner and notifies the Petitioner that he/she may request another pardon after one (1) year from the date of certification of this document.
